* Centropa, a historical institute based in Vienna, interviewed over 1200 elderly Jews in 15 Central European countries, asking them to tell us their entire life stories as they showed us their old family photographs—which we digitized. With over 25,000 photographs, 700+ translated interviews, and 60+ short multimedia films telling our most compelling stories, we work with teachers to use these primary and secondary sources in classes: from history to civics, foreign language to art. Our annual Summer Academy (CSA) gathers teachers from 18 countries to tour the great cities of Central Europe. This year, due to Covid-19, our CSA will be virtual.
